Pupil Premium:

We now receive pupil premium funding which is given to schools for each pupil registered and eligible for pupil premium. The funding is currently £1345 per pupil. This money enables us to support these pupils in any way necessary to improve their education.

You are entitled to claim for Pupil Premium if you are in receipt of any of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Child Tax Credit Only (with income up to £16,190) with no element of Working Tax Credit
- National Asylum Seekers Support
- Guarantee Element of the State Pension Credit
- Employment and Support Allowance (income related)
- Universal Credit (income dependant)

The system is quick and simple to use and can be accessed via a smartphone or hand held device. If you qualify, please show the Application Summary to your school on your smartphone or print a copy for your school.

Please register with the portal, even if you have applied and been unsuccessful in the past. By doing so, we will have your contact details and can inform you straight away if your eligibility changes.

Or give **us consent** to hold your national insurance number so that capita can do regular checks on your eligibility

All “looked after” children are entitled to pupil premium plus. The “virtual School” provides a set amount, which is spent as detailed below; however, we are able to apply for further funding if a child needs more intensive support than this would allow for.

All children who are post looked having been adopted from care or under a special guardianship arrangement are funded at the higher amount of £2345.

Coronavirus: flexibility in reporting requirements

The DfE understands that due to coronavirus and school closures, it is not possible to evaluate the impact of pupil premium for all of the 2019/20 academic year.

We shall therefore monitor and report on the grant's impact at the end of the 2020/21 financial year. This report covers the whole period between September 2019 and March 2021, with detail of impact outlined for the period between September 2020 and December 2020.

At Germander Park School:

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils by focusing on quality first teaching.
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who are in receipt of pupil premium will be socially disadvantaged
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are in receipt of pupil premium. We reserve the right to allocate the premium to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
- Pupil Premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis based on close scrutiny of school data which will help us to identify priority pupils, groups of pupils and classes. Limited funding and resources means that not all pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium will receive or require interventions at any one time.

We have identified the following barriers to success in our school population:

- Lack of support at home
- Weak language and communication skills
- Lack of confidence
- Attendance and punctuality issues
- SEND complex needs
- SEMH needs

The progress of children entitled to pupil premium is monitored throughout the year, particularly in reading, writing and maths.

Their progress is compared to levels of progress expected nationally for a child of their age. If their progress is falling short or exceeding the national expectation, appropriate support and challenge will be put in place in consultation with their class teacher.

This would be a programme of support designed specifically to meet an individual child's needs. This may be delivered by the class teacher themselves or a teaching assistant with the individual or a small group with similar needs.

The impact of the intervention will be reviewed to ensure its effectiveness in terms of the continuing progress of the pupil concerned.

On a case-by-case basis, the remaining funds are allocated to finance uniform and activities or opportunities where a clear learning benefit has been identified for the child. This is considered particularly but not exclusively in cases where the child's attainment and progress is good. Funding may be provided for activities such as:

- Extracurricular clubs which require payment
- Enrichment activity

We will measure the impact of the pupil premium spending using progress and attainment data and comparing pupil premium children with the rest of the school population and with other children nationally.

- The overall aims of your pupil premium strategy
 - To reduce attainment gap between the school's disadvantaged pupils and others nationally
 - To raise the in-school attainment of both disadvantaged pupils and their peers
